

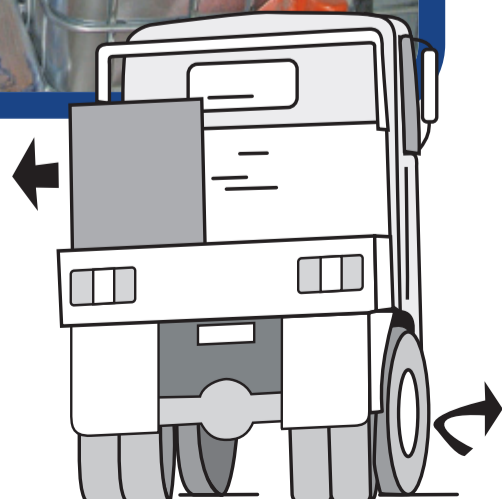
# ADR Packaged Goods Vehicle – PACKAGING & LOAD SECURITY

## Loading

- Refer to transport documentation and ensure details match the load
- Ensure you are qualified to carry the dangerous goods – “ADR Driver Training Certificate”
- Can the load be safely loaded on to the vehicle?
- Check weight distribution of load
- Check if segregation of dangerous goods is necessary, if in doubt, ask!

## Packaging

- DO NOT LOAD damaged or leaking dangerous goods containers
- DO NOT OPEN dangerous good containers
- Packages must be in good condition and free from chemical residue
- Cross check danger labels against documentation
- IF IN DOUBT, REPORT IT and ASK a manager or DGSA for further information
- REFUSE to carry dangerous goods you believe to be non – compliant



## Load Restraint

- Ensure you have adequate and suitable means to secure the load to the vehicle
- Inspect load restraint equipment on a regular basis and replace if damaged
- Dangerous goods **MUST** be secured to the vehicle, such that it cannot move in any direction
- Use packaging or dunnage to fill gaps as necessary
- When unloading a part load, ensure the remaining goods are properly secured before moving on
- Curtain-side, unless certified as load restraint effective, curtains **DO NOT** secure the load on the vehicle
- Take care when opening a load compartment – items may fall out causing serious injury

## Drive with Care

- All drivers must drive with due care and attention!
